



Use Guidelines

FOR ALL-PURPOSE AND LIQUID FORMULA

- 1 Log your waste in your Pyxis, Omnicell, controlled drug inventory sheet, or other automated medication dispensing cabinet.
- 2 Load medications into the Rx Destroyer bottle. Funnel use is optional.
 - Load pills, suppositories, powders, creams, IV BAG waste.
 - Fold patches with medication side exposed into the Rx Destroyer bottle.
 - Squirt syringe dose into bottle. -- DO NOT place syringe or vial into the Rx Destroyer bottle; dispose of these safely into a sharps container.
- 3 Tightly secure cap and gently agitate.
 - Recommended at least 1-2 times a day or per usage
- 4 After each drug disposal session, repeat step #2.
- 5 Bottle is full when contents reach within 2" from the top of the Rx Destroyer bottle.
- 6 Notify authorized team to remove and safely dispose of the full Rx Destroyer bottle according to internal discard protocols.
- 7 Request a replacement Rx Destroyer bottle from the authorized internal team.
- 8 Once secured in an Rx Destroyer locking accessory, your new Rx Destroyer bottle is ready for use.
